The first week I have selected the topic, "The Waning of Pax Americana?," but then we will select the following week's topic from the 2019 Great Decisions series:

- (2) The Middle East: Regional Disorder
- (3) Nuclear Negotiations: Back to the Future?
- (4) The Rise of Populism in Europe
- (5) Decoding U.S.-China Trade
- (6) Cyber Conflicts and Geopolitics
- (7) The United States and Mexico: Partnership Tested
- (8) State of the State Department and Diplomacy

Reading assignments. Each week you should read the brief (approximately ten-page) overview of the topic. This will be posted on the Canvas course web-site (formerly known as TritonED); it will be posted once the next week's topic has been selected.

Class sessions. We will open each session with a brief video prepared by the Foreign Policy Association on the topic that we have chosen for that week's discussion. We will then talk about the "discussion questions" that appear at the end of the assigned reading. Take a few minutes to think about these questions before we meet. Our conversation need not be limited to these questions and you should feel free to raise issues that concern you.

One of the purposes of the Freshman Seminar series is to acquaint you with the Department. So, you should feel free to ask questions about political science that are not limited to the week's topic.

Grades. This course is graded on a Pass/Not-Pass basis. To pass you need to attend three of the four sessions. Active participation is not required, but certainly makes the time go by more enjoyably.
