Course Description

Econometrics deals with the application of statistical methods to economics. In this quarter we will study the extensions of the regression analysis learned in 120B. The topics we will cover are qualitative independent variables (chapter 7), heteroscedasticity (chapter 8), serial correlation (chapter 9), unit roots and error correction models (chapter 10), and simultaneous equation model (chapter 13), if time permits.
