## Course description

Course material: Macroeconomics by G. Mankiw:

- Short intro to macroeconomics: Chapters 1 & 2 define macroeconomics, the main macroeconomic data and issues. It is a quick review of some basic concepts that we will use in macroeconomic models.
- -Economy in the long run: Classical theory: Chapters 3, 4, 5, 6. We use models to understand different issues such as inflation, unemployment... We also analyze the effects of monetary policy fiscal policy, trade policy...Some typical questions that we will answer: Why do central banks fight against inflation? Why is there more unemployment in Europe than in the USA? How to explain the trade deficit in the USA?...

## **Course Description**

Economy in the very long run: Chapters 7, 8 use of growth models to understand the determinants of long term growth, policies to promote growth ...We will understand better why some countries are rich and others are poor. What type of policy can stimulate economic growth in the short and the long term.

-Economy in the short run: Study of the IS-LM model in Chapters 10, 11. We will use this model to study the short run effects of fiscal and monetary policy in the economy.

### Lectures

- Focus on what is the most important in each chapter.
- Insist on some topics with additional material not included in the textbook or lecture slides.
- Exams: essentially based on the examples and problems done in class + homework
- Slides: Outline for each lecture. They do not include lecture notes or solutions to problems studied in class.
