This course surveys issues related to the Japanese economy. You are encouraged to follow the current events in the Japanese economy. There are many web sites that you can visit to follow the economic news from Japan. The ones that I recommend are The Economist (<u>http://www.economist.com</u>) and Nikkei Net Interactive (<u>http://www.nni.nikkei.co.jp</u>). I think UCSD subscribe to both services, so you can access all the articles on these web sites if you are on UCSD network. I ask you to read all the articles on Japan published in *The Economist* during this quarter.

The grade for this course will be determined by four factors.

The grade for the course will be calculated as follows. After each of the scores for homework and exams is normalized so that the full score is 100, the weighted average using the above weights is calculated. The weighted average score is then standardized using the following formula: (standardized score) = floor (70 + 10*[(weighted average score)-(class average)]/(sample standard deviation of weighted average score)). The floor(x) function returns the largest integer value that does not exceed x. The table on the other side of this sheet shows the correspondence between standardized scores and letter grades.
