### **ECON 138: The Economics of Discrimination**

<u>Course overview</u>: This course will investigate differences in economic outcomes on the basis of race, gender, ethnicity, religion and sexual orientation. We will study economic theories of discrimination, empirical work testing those theories, and policies aimed at alleviating group-level differences in economic outcomes. This course is also designed to teach students how to discuss controversial topics in a respectful, informed and inclusive manner, both through explicit instruction and by modeling respectful, informed and inclusive discussions in class.
