# **Course Description**

Econometrics deals with the application of statistical methods to economics. It is concerned with (1) estimating economic relationships, (2) confronting economic theory with facts and testing hypotheses involving economic behavior, and (3) forecasting the behavior of economic variables. This is the second of the three-quarter Econometrics 120A-B-C sequence. In this second quarter we will study in detail the estimation of economic relationships, the basic classical linear regression model, tests of hypotheses, and forecasting. **Attendance in lecture is mandatory**. *Prerequisites: Economics 120A*
