## ECONOMICS OF THE MIDDLE EAST

# **Syllabus**

We will discuss socioeconomic development in the Arab world in comparison to other countries in the less and more developed worlds, with secondary attention to Iran and Turkey. The text for the course is:

Meier, Gerald M. and James E. Rauch. *Leading Issues in Economic Development*. Eighth edition, 2005.

<u>Lectures:</u> You are responsible for all the material and announcements in the lectures. There will be a guest lecture on January 15 by Michael Provence of the History department. He is an expert on Syria and will discuss the origins of its current civil war.

## **Timeline and grading:**

One of the goals of this course is for you to become familiar with how to use publicly available data to check facts and satisfy your curiosity about the Middle East. To further this goal I ask you to prepare a brief set of slides (that would take you less than five minutes to present) that make an interesting comparison of Arab countries, Iran or Turkey with each other or with relevant other countries. (Do not include Israel/Palestine because it is covered well in other courses at UCSD.) The slides can be self-contained, or you can provide no more than one page of descriptive notes. The most general database in which you can look for data is World Development Indicators (<a href="http://databank.worldbank.org/data/Databases.aspx">http://databank.worldbank.org/data/Databases.aspx</a>), but there are lots of other more specific ones such as the Barro-Lee educational attainment data (<a href="http://www.barrolee.com/">http://www.barrolee.com/</a>) and the World Health Organization urban air pollution database (<a href="http://www.who.int/phe/health\_topics/outdoorair/databases/en/">http://www.who.int/phe/health\_topics/outdoorair/databases/en/</a>). You must submit a first draft to one of the TAs for approval before submitting a final draft.
